Dear Mr. Inman:

I am writing to once again convey my deep sympathies for the loss your family has endured, as well as to express my admiration for the extraordinary efforts you have expended on behalf of your son Dustin, who tragically lost his life sixteen years ago this month. The burden you have shouldered as a result of Dustin's death, in addition to the continuing and daily struggles you face with the care of your wife Patricia, are worthy of recognition.

As we discussed during our recent telephone call, that there is currently no treaty-based or other legal mechanism by which Gonzalez Gonzalo Harrell can be extradited to the United States. While I recognize how difficult it must be to accept this reality, the reaches of the law are limited. In this case, because Mexican law does not criminalize vehicular manslaughter absent a showing of intent to commit the crime, there is no available legal remedy at this time.

Notwithstanding the limitations of the law, you should be comforted by the fact that your efforts have not been in vain. Your tireless fight for justice has reached the highest levels of both the United States and Mexican governments and your family's loss has touched us all. Your continued advocacy and energy has kept your son's memory alive, a praiseworthy fact of which you should be proud.

As I mentioned during our call, it was an honor for me to be of service to you and your family. Please know that should additional information be brought to light that is material to the Department's analysis of the case, we welcome the opportunity to review it and will do so expeditiously.
