A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT

To amend Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to 1 2 drivers' licenses, so as to clarify and provide for persons who may obtain certain licenses, 3 permits, or cards; to define terms; to provide for driving safety cards for persons who possess 4 Employment Authorization Documents from the United States Department of Homeland 5 Security with certain codes thereon which shall operate the same as drivers' licenses; to 6 provide for exceptions; to provide for the design of driving safety cards; to provide for 7 special identification cards for persons who possess Employment Authorization Documents 8 from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services with certain codes thereon; to 9 provide for the design of such special identification cards; to provide for criminal penalties; 10 to provide for related matters; to provide for a contingent effective date; to repeal conflicting 11 laws; and for other purposes.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF GEORGIA:

13 **SECTION 1.** 14 Chapter 5 of Title 40 of the Official Code of Georgia Annotated, relating to drivers' licenses, 15 is amended by revising paragraph (15) of and adding a new paragraph to Code Section 40-5-1, relating to definitions, to read as follows: 16 17 "(15) 'Resident' means a person who has a permanent home or abode in Georgia to 18 which, whenever such person is absent, he or she has the intention of returning. For the 19 purposes of this chapter, there is a rebuttable presumption that the following person is 20 a resident: 21 (A) Any person who accepts employment or engages in any trade, profession, or occupation in Georgia or enters his or her children to be educated in the private or 22 23 public schools of Georgia within ten days after the commencement of such employment 24 or education; or (B) Any person who, except for infrequent, brief absences, has been present in the state 25 26 for 30 or more days;

provided, however, that no person shall be considered a resident for purposes of this
chapter unless such person is either a United States citizen or an alien with legal
authorization from the United States Immigration and Naturalization Service lawful status
as reflected by an Employment Authorization Document code from the United States
Citizenship and Immigration Services."

32 "(19) 'Unlawful status EAD code' means a code placed on such Employment
 33 Authorization Document that indicates such person is not present in the United States
 34 under a lawful status, including, but not limited to, code A10, A11, A13, A14, C13, C14,
 35 C18, and C33."

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SECTION 2.

Said chapter is further amended by revising subsections (a) and (c) and adding new
subsections to Code Section 40-5-20, relating to license required, surrender of prior licenses,
and local licenses prohibited, to read as follows:

- 40 "(a) No person, except those expressly exempted in this chapter or in Chapter 6 of this title, 41 shall drive any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless such person has a valid 42 driver's license or a driving safety card under this chapter for the type or class of vehicle 43 being driven. Any person who is a resident of this state for 30 days shall obtain a Georgia 44 driver's license before operating a motor vehicle in this state. Any court having jurisdiction 45 over traffic offenses in this state shall report to the department the name and other 46 identifying information of any individual convicted of driving without a license. This Code 47 section shall not apply to a person driving with a suspended license or license that has been 48 revoked. Any person convicted of violating this Code section shall be punished as provided in subsection (a) of Code Section 40-5-121; provided, however, that if: 49
- 50 (1) Such person is driving with a driver's license issued by this state that has been 51 expired for less than 31 days at the time of the offense and he or she produces in court a 52 driver's license that would have been valid at the time of the offense, he or she shall not 53 be guilty of such offense; and
- 54 (2) Such person is driving without a valid driver's license or receipt issued by the
 55 department reflecting issuance, renewal, replacement, or reinstatement in his or her
 56 possession but he or she has a valid driver's license, Code Section 40-5-29 shall apply to
 57 such offense.
- (a.1)(1) Except as provided for in subsection (a.2) of this Code section, any person
 possessing an Employment Authorization Document from the United States Citizenship
 and Immigration Services with an unlawful status EAD code shall obtain a Georgia
 driving safety card before operating a motor vehicle in this state. Pursuant to the terms
 of this subsection, upon payment of the required fee, the department shall issue to every

94	bottom, or both, of the driving safety card, include the terms 'DRIVING SAFETY
95	CARD', 'NOT FOR IDENTIFICATION', 'NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR OFFICIAL
96	PURPOSES', 'NON-CITIZEN' and 'NOT FOR FEDERAL IDENTIFICATION'. Other
97	than as provided for in this paragraph, a driving safety card shall contain the same
98	physical characteristics of, and be similar in form to, a driver's license issued by the

100(6) The department shall not issue any temporary driving privileges as provided for in101subsection (e) of Code Section 40-5-24 to any person who presents an Employment102Authorization Document from the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services103with an unlawful status EAD code.

(a.2) No person possessing an Employment Authorization Document from the United 104 105 States Citizenship and Immigration Services with an unlawful status EAD code shall be eligible to obtain a driver's license or a special identification card other than a special 106 107 identification card provided for under subsection (d) of Code Section 40-5-21.1; provided, however, that any person who possesses an Employment Authorization Document from the 108 United States Citizenship and Immigration Services with an unlawful status EAD code and 109 who has a valid driver's license or special identification card other than a special 110 identification card provided for under subsection (d) of Code Section 40-5-21.1 shall, upon 111 expiration of such driver's license or special identification card, be subject to the provisions 112 113 of this chapter relating to a driving safety card or special identification card."

193 (2) Prior to the issuance of such special identification card as provided for in 194 paragraph (1) of this subsection, the department shall obtain the fingerprints of the 195 applicant.

- 196(3)(A) The department shall distinguish the special identification card provided for in197this subsection from other personal identification cards issued by the department by the198use of a unique design and color.
- (B) A special identification card provided for in this subsection shall, in white letters
 displayed on a black banner positioned at the top or bottom, or both, of the special
 identification card, include the terms 'NOT ACCEPTABLE FOR OFFICIAL
 PURPOSES' and 'NOT FOR FEDERAL IDENTIFICATION'. Other than as provided
 for in this paragraph, such special identification card shall contain the same physical
 characteristics of, and be similar in form to, other personal identification cards issued
 by the department."

207	Said chapter is further amended by revising subsection (b) and adding new subsections to
208	Code Section 40-5-21.2, relating to compliance with the Systematic Alien Verification for
209	Entitlements Program, application, and implementation, to read as follows:

SECTION 6. Said chapter is further amended by revising paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) of Code Section 40-5-120, relating to the unlawful use of license or identification card and penalties for violations of chapter generally, as follows:

 254 canceled, revoked, or suspended driver's license or personal identification card issued
 255 pursuant to Code Section 40-5-100 this chapter;
- (2) Fail or refuse to surrender to the department upon lawful demand any driver's license
 or personal identification card issued pursuant to Code Section 40-5-100 this chapter
 which has been suspended, revoked, disqualified, or canceled;

261 SECTION 7. 262 (a) This Act shall become effective only if funds are specifically appropriated for purposes

- 263 of this Act in an appropriations Act enacted by the General Assembly.
- (b) If funds are so appropriated, then this Act shall become effective on the later of:
 - (1) The date on which such appropriations Act becomes effective; or
 - (2) The beginning date of the fiscal year for which such appropriations are made.
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SECTION 8.

All laws and parts of laws in conflict with this Act are repealed.
